2011 ANNUAL CASE ANALYSIS

The total number of Internal Affairs Cases decreased this year.

Since 2005, a new option of handling complaints (via an "Internal Affairs Contact Report") was made available to the Department. As a result, the Department has seen a general decrease in the number of Internal Affairs Investigations. These Internal Affairs Contact Reports have given supervisors the opportunity to immediately address situations of a minor nature with an employee.

After reviewing cases investigated by the Internal Affairs Section, there does not appear to be a need to readdress any specific areas of policies and procedures.
